CRISP started a further phase of the long-term project „Peace and Conflict Consultants“ (PCC) in Vadui lui Voda, Moldova. [Read more](#)



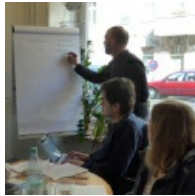
Values at Stake

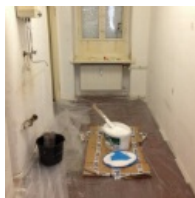
Our Assistant: Aydar Gazizullin
