Video: Simulating Egyptian Transition

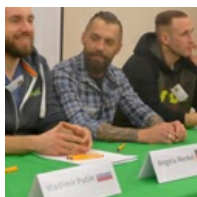

Kodori: 17 Diplomats and 17 countries

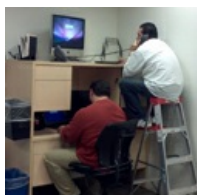

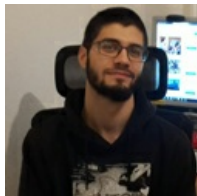
