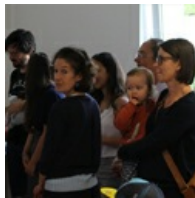
Workshop for IPS Fellows: *Taberlingen*

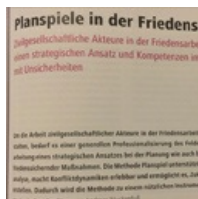
